<p>Writing/Art – Main Idea – Father’s Day- All About Dad</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Create a poster for your dad or grandfather. There are template ideas added to the site or you can create your own. Talk with your dad/granddad first about their favourite things, then use the information to create the posters. Decorate and colour the poster. 2. Make a Father’s Day Card. There is a template with pictures you can use or choose your own idea. Fold the paper in half. Glue Happy Father’s Day on the front and the other 2 sheets inside. Write your own note and draw a picture. Colour and decorate. Give it to Dad or Grandpa for Father’s Day. 	<p>Math – Skip Counting/Exercise – Can Do Outside</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Count backwards by 10s from 107 to 7 while you do jumping jacks. Count by 2s starting at 70 and going to 100 while you take giant steps up and down the driveway. Count backwards by 1s from 60, while hop up and down the driveway. Count by 2s starting at 1 and going up to 71, while you sit and alternate touching your toes. Count by 5s to 100 while you skip with or without a rope. 	<p>Art – Something Special For Dad or Grandpa</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> On a nature walk look for some good sized rocks you can paint and decorate and then write the words Dad/Papa/My Dad Rocks etc... Find some scrap paper and material you could use to make a collage. Outline the shape of a fish on a sheet of paper first. Using the paper or material, glue it in to the shape you made to create the picture of the fish. Add background and details when you are done. Create a painting or drawing, use what you have. It could be an outdoor scene or their favourite thing. Add details. Give for Father’s Day.
<p>Math – Card Game – Play with your family. Go Fish – Facts for 15 – Ways to make 15</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A good way to work on math facts! Each player gets 8 cards. All the others are spread out in the middle face down. Players match up cards in their hands that are facts for 12. When you put them down say the fact – Ex: $9+6=15$, $10+5=15$, $7+8=15$, $8+7=15$ Face cards: J=11, Q= 12, K=13 On your turn ask another player for a card you need to make 15. If they don’t have it, go fish! When you put your pair down, say the fact for 15. Ex: $11+4=15$ First person to match all cards to make 11 wins! 	<p>Word Work Game – Play With Your Family</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. How many words can you make out of the words: <u>Happy Father’s Day</u>: Set a time: 15-20 minutes. Write down all the words you can make using those letters. Every word we write, has to have a vowel in it. Think of word families and endings. Read out your words. Whoever has the most words wins! 2. Write an Acrostic Poem – A poem where the letters of each line spell out a word or sentence about the topic. <p>D ___ P ___ * There are idea templates on the A ___ A ___ site, or you can do your own. D ___ P ___ * decorate and colour, give for A ___ Father’s Day.</p>	<p>Build/Make/Writing - Father’s Day Hanging or Sign.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> There is a template on the site you can use or create your own. (Could use craft sticks if you had them instead of paper.) The top board on the sign says: What I Love About Dad/Papa.... On each of the 5 boards under write down one thing you love about your mom: Good cook, Plays with me, Reads to me etc... Cut out the sign picture and glue it to a piece of construction paper or cardboard. Colour and decorate each board and the top and bottom board too. Draw pictures around it. Use string or yarn, cut a piece to glue or tape to the back of each corner at the top, so it can hang. Give for Father’s Day.
<p>Story – Reading Comprehension/Poem</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> When we read, we learn things about the story or poem we are reading. We find out information that we can use to answer questions or retell the poem. Use all information: title, pictures, labels, poem. Read the poem – Daddy Longlegs. The poem can be found on the class page. Make sure you read the poem at least twice. Retell the poem to someone at home. <p>Read the questions and circle the answer. If you can’t remember, go back and read again and underline where you find the answer in the poem.</p>	<p>Writing/Art Main Idea – Summer – Sheet on site</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> We are making our way to the end of the year and summer vacation is almost here. Think of what you would like to do this summer: Beach, swim, camp, bike, play outside. What are things you love about summer? What do you think of when you hear the word summer? Have a good opening sentence. Tell good details using describing words. Have a good ending sentence and begin and end your sentences right. Draw a picture. 	<p>Math – Compare and Order Numbers to 100</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Put these 5 numbers in order from least to greatest: 98/ 43/ 76/ 55/ 61. Circle the odd numbers. Put these 5 numbers in order from greatest to least: 79/ 57/ 84/ 68/ 99. Circle the even numbers. Put these 5 numbers in order from least to greatest: 81/ 63/ 52/ 96 / 77. Circle the odd numbers. Put these 5 numbers in order from greatest to least: 56/73/ 94/ 65/ 80. Circle the even numbers. There is a sheet on the site, or do on paper.
