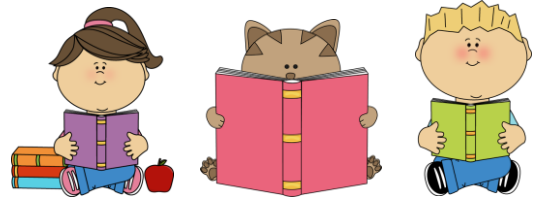


## Reading Comprehension Strategies



- When we read we learn new things about the story or book we are reading.
- We find out information about the topic that we can use to answer questions or retell the story.
- Here are some strategies you can use to help make sure that we understand what we read and to help when you are doing reading comprehension.

| 1. Read the story more than once. Sometimes we miss things the first time.  |
| 2. Ask questions as you read and predict what you think might happen next.  |
| 3. After each page or part of the story stop and retell: Who and What. 1) Who or what did I read about. 2) What were they doing?          |
| 4. Make a picture in your mind of what you are reading.   |
| 5. <u>Infer</u> - Sometimes they do not tell the exact answer, but they give clues or key words to what they are saying or talking about. |
| 6. After you are done reading, retell the story to someone else.  |
| 7. Read over the questions about the story. Go back and find the answer in the story and underline or highlight it.                       |
