Home Learning Activities for November 2-5

Literacy: Squiggle Park (10 minutes)

Read and/or be read to each day. **Practice** tracing letters in your alphabet tracing book. Review all zoo-phonics letters and sounds. Practice your "Rock Star" words.

Our Zoo-phonics animal friend for **Ff** is Francy fish. Can you think of at least 3 items/words that begin with the sound of Ff. Draw a picture to go with your words. Say each word slowly and try to label your pictures. Visit the **Starfall** link and click on the letter f. Explore other letters while on the site. Practice printing the letter Ff. Remember to start your letters at the top!

Visit https://www.storylineonline.net/ and choose a story. After listening to the story draw a picture of your favorite part using the "Reading Response" page in your home learning packet.

Play one of the alphabet snakes and ladders games in your learning packet.

Writing: Draw a picture of you having fun at home. (or choose your own topic) Make sure to add details. Add labels or a sentence if you can.

Math: Visit the **IXL Math** link throughout the week. There are some great activities on there for Kindergarten.
