- We usually do Art a couple days a week and is incorporated with other classes as well. Our STEAM time is Friday – This is where the students choose what to make, build or create.

<p>Art Time - Do You Want To Make A Snowman?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Find some different types and colour of paper around the house. • Cut out 3 circles from a white piece of paper. (big/medium/small) • Glue them together with the biggest on the bottom, then medium and small on top. • Cut out pieces to make a face: eyes, nose, mouth. • Make a hat, arms, and a scarf. • Once you get all the pieces, glue them on the snowman. • What else can you add to it? Be creative! • Hang it up in your house. 	<p>Build/Create – Get Someone At Home To Help and have fun! Snowman Time!!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission – Build/Make 3 snowman • One that is shorter than you; One that is as tall as you; one that is taller than you. • Find materials outside that you can use for the face, eyes, nose, mouth. • What can you find in the yard for the arms? • What about a hat or scarf? Maybe some buttons down the front? • Then draw a picture of the final product. Add good details and label it. • Send a picture to me and I will add it to the website! 	<p>Build/Create/Draw – Get Your Family To Help!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mission – Make or build something out of recycled/reused materials that you could use at home. • Discuss with your family things that you need for inside or outside. • What could you make that would be useful with the materials you have at home? Be creative! • Draw a picture of what you made. • How many? – Use tally marks to keep track of the number of items you use.
<p>Create/Writing/Art</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a book about winter or something of your choice. Take a walk outside to observe winter happenings. • Get 2 pieces of paper, put them together and fold them in half. • Put the title on the cover and draw a picture. Remember to put your name as author and illustrator. • Tell one fact on each page and draw a picture to go with it. Remember to add good details to your writing and drawing. • Read your book to someone at home. 	<p>Scavenger Hunt – Walk With Someone At Home</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It’s Winter! We can hear and see lots of changes outside. • Make a list of the things below and see if you can see or hear them on your walk. • Check off the items as you find them. <p>A) Birds – Some stay for the winter B) A bird singing C) Animals – Some do not hibernate D) Snow hill E) icicles F) Pine tree G) snowman H) Frozen water – pond/brook/stream/river I) A nest in a tree – with no leaves, easier to see J) Snowflakes – Catch a few can you see the 6 sides? * Have fun!!</p>	<p>Art Fun – Mitten Time</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trace the outline of your hands on a piece of paper with a pencil to make a pair of mittens. • Keep your fingers together, but the thumb apart. • Go over the outline with a dark crayon. • Make a pattern or picture on the mittens and colour them. • Remember mittens are a pair, so they should be the same. • Cut them out, see if you have string or ribbon and tape an end to the back of each mitten. Hang them up in your house.
<p>Art Fun – Winter Scene</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Check around the house for different pieces of paper/ribbon/scrap material or other items to use. • Cut out shapes and pieces to create a winter scene. Snowman, sliding, snow covered trees, skating, snowflakes. • Shade in a background on your paper and then glue on the pieces for your scene. 	<p>Time To Get Cooking!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Decide what you would like to make. It could be a sandwich for lunch, get a snack ready, make some cookies. Your choice. • Get what you need. Follow a recipe or think of the steps you will need to follow in order, to make it. Get someone at home to help. • Enjoy what you make with your family! 	<p>Build/Draw</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build a structure of your choice. • Get your family to help. Use whatever materials you would like. • Draw a picture of what you made when you are done. • How many? – Use tally marks to keep track of the number of items you use.
