We want to advise the public that a great deal of misinformation is circulating on social media and in the community. A lot of it is opinion, speculation and/or false information. We have also been made aware of people exhibiting threatening and bullying behaviour. Please know that negative talk and posts have a terrible impact on our vulnerable students and populations. It elevates the risk for them and their well-being. Please give careful thought before you speak or post; be kind and considerate to one another.

Bullying is a serious **societal issue**, and it happens in many different environments within our community. It is up to all of us to collectively address this problem in a constructive manner. Some individuals have been targeted and victimized as a result of a growing number of negative comments on-line and in the community. Our schools and student bodies are being impacted by all the negative comments and posts. They are dealing with much more than anyone can imagine, on top of this latest tragedy. Again, it is time for all of us to show compassion, patience and caring towards all those involved.

You can be assured that we are taking this case and all cases of bullying very seriously. **If you are aware of someone being threatened or bullied, report it to the police or school principal immediately.**

Our region has been through so much tragedy in recent weeks. Now more than ever, we need to come together as a community and look after one another. The long heralded adage, "It takes a village to raise a child", is especially poignant at this time.


