

Grade 2 Home Learning – Week 1 – Choose any three in a row to do during the week!

<p>Writing/Art Work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make a book about rabbits. Check the scholastic site for a story and video about rabbits. • Get 2 pieces of paper, put them together and fold them in half. • Put the title on the cover and draw a picture. Remember to put your name as author and illustrator. • Tell one fact on each page and draw a picture to go with it. Remember to add good details to your writing and drawing. • Read your book to someone at home. 	<p>Math – Skip Counting/Exercising</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Count by 5s to 100 while you do jumping jacks. • Count by 10s starting at 7 and going to 107, while you skip on the spot. (Can you count higher?) • Count by 2s to 50 while you sit and touch your toes using opposite arms. • Count backwards from 30 by 1s while you jog on the spot. 	<p>Build/Draw/Write</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Build a structure of your choice. • Get your family to help. Use whatever materials you would like. • Draw a picture of what you made when you are done. • How many? – Use tally marks to keep track of the number of items you use. • Then write about it. What did you make? What did you use? How did you make it?
<p>Math – Card Game – Play with your family. Go Fish – Ways To Make 10</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each player gets 8 cards. • All the others are spread out in the middle face down. • Players match up cards in their hands that make 10 – Ex. 6+4=10, 5+5=10. • A 10 and face cards =10, for those say 10+0=10 or 0+10=10 when you put them down. • On your turn ask another player for a card you need to make a 10. If they don't have it, go fish! • First person to match all their card to make 10 wins! 	<p>Writing – Main Idea – Easter</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write about Easter! • Have a good opening sentence that uses voice and tells how you feel about the topic. • Tell good details about the main idea and what you like about it. • Have a good ending sentence about the main idea. • Remember to begin and end your sentences the right way. • Draw a picture to go with your writing. • Read it to someone at home! 	<p>Art Fun – Easter Eggs – Do with your family</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Grab a sheet of paper and make a big egg shape on it. • You can design or decorate it the way you would like. • Maybe you want a pattern or pictures or pint it or do it as a collage. • Use the materials you have at home to decorate; crayons, markers, paint, glue, colored paper. Whatever you have. Be creative. Make it your own! • When your eggs are done, put them up around your house to decorate.
<p>Story Time</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Read a book to someone at home. • Have them read a book to you. • Discuss your books. How are they the same? How are they different? • What was your favourite thing about the book? Did you like the characters or main idea? <p>Draw a picture to go with it.</p>	<p>Writing/Art – Make An Easter Card</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Fold a piece of paper in half. • On the front write Happy Easter, or a greeting of your choice and decorate. • Inside: On one side writ your own note to the person you are giving it to: Dear... • Make sure you sign who the card is from. • On the other side draw and colour your own Easter picture. 	<p>Math – Calendar Work</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Can you name the days of the week and the months of the year? • Say them out loud in order and then try to write them down. • Look at a calendar you have at home to see if you have them in the right order. • What other things do we use a calendar for, what information does it tell us?
