

## Home Learning April 27-May 1 Have fun doing these activities this week!

### Language Arts

Sammy Snake begins with the letter Ss. Check out this video on snakes.

Tell someone 2 facts you learned about snakes. Write about what you learned. Remember that when we write we sound out the words the best we can. Start each sentence with a capital letter, uses spaces between your words and a period, exclamation mark or question mark to end your sentence. Read your sentence(s) to someone.

### Language Arts

Sammy Snake begins with the letter Ss. Can you think of 6 words that begin with the letter "s"? Draw a picture of each object and try and spell the words on your own. Remember only print the letter sounds you hear. If you only hear the beginning sound in sun as "s" and the ending sound as "n" then just print sn for the word.

Practice making the letter "s" in the sand or on a cookie sheet with salt or sugar. Watch my video on making sight words in sugar. Have fun!

### Math

Measurement Activity-Listen to the story "To Be Long", at Pearson Mathology:

Have an adult measure you with a piece of string/yarn from your head to your toe. Use the yarn to find objects in your house that are longer, shorter and the same length as you.

### Math

Measurement Activity. The reticulated python is the longest snake in the world. It is 32 feet (10 meters) long. It is almost the length of a school bus. WOW! Go outside and measure your driveway. Is your driveway longer or shorter than this snake? If you were to use the string that is the length of you, how many of these strings would it take to be the length of this snake?

Use it to measure. Can you find something that is longer, shorter, or about the same length as your snake. Be sure to send me a picture of your snake. Have fun!!
