

## Using Quotations Lesson

When using a quotation from an expert, or someone experienced in what you are writing about remember: write who said the quotation and who they are, including position. **Example: Mr. Bosma, English Language Arts teacher at Nelson Rural School, said, “The ability to research credible sources, quotations, statistics and facts, is very important to the strength of your written argument.”**

**Please make sure you know the website who the actual person is from when using the quotation and who they are (Doctor, scientist, mayor etc.)**

**Don't just explain the quotation is from a site. Explain who they are. If you can't, you may have to use another quotation.**

**You can quote the author of a site.**
