<b>Monday</b>	<p>Practice counting forwards and backwards 0-100, 100-0). Go outside and practice skip counting while completing some exercises. Bring your favourite books inside to read them. Discuss the stories that you read with a family member. Your questions may be: Who were the characters? What happened at the beginning, middle &amp; end of the story? What was your favourite part and why?</p>	<p>Look around your house to find your favourite toy. Draw a picture of the toy and describe it. What is it? Why is it your favourite? Where did it come from? Discuss the size, colour, and its function. Remember the 5 finger rule. Start with a good beginning sentence. Add at least 3 detailed sentences about the toy and finish off with a good ending sentence. Draw a picture!</p>

Before going to bed grab a flashlight, turn off your lights and play "Seek the Sight Word". Your parent will call out a word and you must shine your light on that word.</p>	<p>Pick something to bake with your family. Work as a team to add ingredients and mix things up. When you are finished baking. Write the steps that you followed to complete the recipe. Remember to use words like First, Next, Then, After that, Finally.</p>
Friday	<p>Go out on a nature walk. Find different items(sticks, pine cones, rocks, leaves, etc.) Bring them back and sort them.
